Director's Note

Humanity has been speculating about the existence of alternative life forms since the dawn of time. From the Egyptian pyramids to the Nazca lines, to the arrival of Steven Spielberg's *E.T.*, our obsession with the extraterrestrial is constantly evolving. Artificial intelligence is also nothing new — Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein*, Ridley Scott's *Bladerunner*, and Disney's *Wall–E* all imagine A.I. living amongst humanity. But what about humanity living amongst artificial intelligence?! With today's engagement with gaming, digital avatars, cosplay subculture and ever evolving A.I. tools, one can only wonder — what will happen next?

Collaborating with students from a Devised Theatre course last fall, we looked to Karel Čapek's 1920 play Rossum's Universal Robot's — which introduces the word "robot" — as a starting place to create new works. It was interesting to discover that students were inclined to devise performances that evoked vintage representations of artificial intelligence, staying far away from any contemporary sense of A.I. Fast forward, some of that student work will be showcased in the cabaret along with other AAA offerings from alumni, faculty and local Lethbridge talent.

The Al, Avatars and Aliens Cabaret embraces the technology and aesthetics of the past, with references to 2001: A Space Odessey, Star Trek, Indiana Jones and ... David Bowie! We hope that our audience will be transported by our vintage sci-fi dream world, sparking nostalgia and inciting laughter along the way, while also raising questions about the future. Michelle Sylvestre (Currently a PHD student) is an interdisciplinary artist, educator and PhD student in Cultural, Social, and Political Thought. She holds a BFA in Art (2017), and an MFA in New Media (2021) receiving SSHRC, Elizabeth II Graduate, and Dean's Tuition scholarships. Sylvestre's current work explores speculative futures and the potential for storytelling, performance, and artistic inquiry to critique systemic biases in Artificial Intelligence (AI).



Using research-creation, she merges critical inquiry with artistic practice to address complex sociocultural challenges, advocating for equity and inclusion in technology. Currently, she is developing interdisciplinary workshops as part of her PhD work and her role as Researcher in Residence with the University of Lethbridge's Abundance Intelligence Niitsitapi Pod.

The ImpromptOu Players are the improvised arm of Theatre Outre, Lethbridge's Queer Theatre Company. Formed in 2017 by David Gabert and Erica Arrieus, ImpromptOu produces a variety of monthly shows in Lethbridge at Good Times Lethbridge Comedy Club with unscripted shows that push the boundaries of sexual, gender and cultural norms. Shows include Queer-prov: Uncensored Song & Sketch Show, Card Chaos: Improvised Party Show, As The World Burns: Lethbridge's Improvised Soap Opera, Trebl-Quest: An Improvised Fantasy Musical and No Way Out: An Improvised Tragicomedy. It has toured shows across Alberta and Saskatchewan with members who have worked and performed improv together since they were a part of the University of Lethbridge Improv Club in 2005 to those who have graduated as recently as 2024. Today, the ImpromptOu players are made up of University of Lethbridge Alumni from various faculties and members of the community who take part in performances throughout the year between other performances and the daily grind. They are incredibly excited to share a glimpse of their improvised storytelling with you as a part of the cabaret and return to the stage at the University that started so many of their iournevs.
