Terms Used

GLER course: A course that could count toward the General Liberal Education Requirement (see below). You may use courses in your major towards this 12-course requirement. See the 2013/2014 University of Lethbridge Calendar, Part 4 - Academic Regulations (p. 88) for complete information.
