___ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all UofL and transferable courses taken within the semesters containing the last 20 courses ( 60.0 credit hours). All courses must be graded with the exception of Education 2500.
___ Minimum of eight courses ( 24.0 credit hours) in the major.
Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all transferable courses.
Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.
