## Program Requirements

Completion of the requirements for both the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Accounting Fundamentals and the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Advanced Accounting with cumulative and graduation grade point averages of at least 2.00 for each certificate.

Students may not double count courses towards the certificates. The 6 courses counting towards the Advanced Accounting Certificate must be distinct from the 10 courses counted towards the Accounting Fundamentals.

This combined program is designed to provide a suitable combination of breadth and depth of knowledge in accounting from the fundamentals to advanced levels.

### Minimum Grade Requirement

### Residence Requirement

Students must complete at least 5 courses towards the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Accounting Fundamentals and at least 5 distinct courses towards the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Advanced Accounting at the University of Lethbridge.

### Program Length

Completion of this program may take five terms of study due to course sequencing. All Combined Post-Bachelor Certificate in Accounting requirements must be completed within 5 years after acceptance into the Dhillon School of Business.
