Students may **not** count French 1000 (Beginners' French I) among the minimum requirements for the major.

French 2250 is a required course along with the off-campus study term. ### Language courses

Students registering in introductory or intermediate language courses must complete the Student Information Form to determine whether they are registered in the appropriate course. Students may be asked to write a French Placement and/or French Advanced Placement Test. Advanced placement may be granted to students who have acquired language skills outside of a formal academic environment. Students with no French background should plan on completing the following language progression:

French 1000 - 1100 - 2010 - 2020 - 3010 - 3020

Students with high school immersion (French Language Arts 30 or Français 30) or equivalent background should initially register in French 2020 (but may be placed in French 2010, 2020, or 3010).

### Notes

<sup>1</sup> French 2010 and 2020 is the standard pattern; students who place into French 2020 will complete French 2020 and one additional senior French course; students who place directly into French 3010 will complete two additional senior French courses.

### Faculty of Education Admission

To be considered for admission to the Faculty of Education, successful completion of the following is required:

- 14 graded term courses (42.0 credit hours).
- **Education Admission GPA:** Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all U of L and transferable courses taken within the terms containing the last 14 courses (42.0 credit hours). All courses must be graded.
- Minimum of five courses (15.0 credit hours) in the major.
- **Major GPA:** Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all transferable courses.
- Credit in Education 2500 - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) prior to the fall program intake, including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.

Liberal Education List Requirement

Only four courses (12.0 credit hours) in total may be counted from any one discipline toward the Lib Ed Requirement. Disciplines are identified by separate course subject codes. Cross-listed courses count toward the limit for both disciplines (e.g. IGBM 3250/INDG 3250 counts toward the limit for Dhillon School of Business courses and Indigenous Studies).

Only four courses (12.0 credit hours) in total from the Faculty of Education (EDUC), Faculty of Health Sciences (ADCS, HLSC, INHL, NURS, PUBH, and TREC), and the Dhillon School of Business (ACCT, AGEM, FINC, GLBU, HRLR, IGBM, MGT, and MKTG) may be counted towards the Lib Ed Requirement.

General Requirements

Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science

- A minimum of 30 courses (90.0 credit hours) from disciplines offered by the Faculty of Arts and Science, Faculty of Fine Arts, or School of Liberal Education with a GPA of at least 2.00 (on the University of Lethbridge 4.0 scale).
A maximum of three Independent Study courses (9.0 credit hours) may be completed for credit toward the degree.
A maximum of three Disciplinary Credit Applied Studies courses (9.0 credit hours) may be completed for credit towards the degree. Students may, in addition, complete Applied Studies 2000, 2001, 2010, and 2011. For Art majors, Museum Studies Internship courses (Museum Studies 4000, 4001, and 4002) are included in this limit.
A maximum of 17 courses (51.0 credit hours) may be completed from any one discipline (see Faculty of Arts and Science in the 2025/2026 University of Lethbridge Calendar, www.ulethbridge.ca/ross/academic-calendar). Disciplines are identified by a specific course label (e.g. KNES, ASTR, and HIST are separate disciplines).
A maximum of 6.0 credit hours in Activity courses (i.e. courses labelled PHAC and MUSE) may be completed for credit towards the degree, except for Kinesiology majors (not more than 15.0 credit hours) and Music majors (not more than 12.0 credit hours).
Residence requirement: a minimum of 15 courses (45.0 credit hours) offered by the Faculty of Arts and Science, Faculty of Fine Arts, or School of Liberal Education must be completed at the University of Lethbridge. At least half of the courses required in the major must be completed at the University of Lethbridge.

A maximum of 10 courses (30.0 credit hours) may be completed at the 1000 level (or lower) for credit towards the degree, excluding Activity courses (labelled PHAC and MUSE) and courses numbered in the range of 0520 to 0530.

### Admission to the Faculty of Education

Education 2500 must be completed (with a Pass Recommend) before admission. It may be taken in the winter or summer term immediately prior to the fall intake

### Fourth Year (Fall)

1. Students who have completed French 30 or French 31 (or equivalent) should complete French 2010 and French 2020 in their first year of studies. Students who have completed French Language Arts 30 or Français 30 (or equivalent) should initially register in French 2020 (but may be placed in French 2010, 2020, or 3010). Students who have completed none of the previously mentioned courses should begin with French 1000 or 1100 (as indicated by the placement test) and should seek advice on course sequencing from the Department Advisor in Modern Languages.

2. The minimum requirements in the FVSP comprise a total of three courses. Students may wish to take two additional approved courses during this term or will need to complete two additional Arts and Science courses to satisfy degree requirements.

**Note:** Courses in bold in Years 1 and 2 of the sample sequence are prerequisite(s) for required courses and should be completed early in your program. Students are advised to review the prerequisites for elective courses within the major and plan accordingly.
